PARKING INFORMATION

This is a reminder that if a student is self-driving, a student parking space must be purchased and information regarding the car should be on file. Please note that there is a difference between a parent parking sticker and a student parking sticker. Once students complete the process, the student will receive a designated parking space.

This is the process to obtain a student parking sticker:

1. Use this link to pay the \$75 student parking fee online <https://payit.nelnet.net/form/p7ZNJ5W7>.
2. Bring the receipt, a copy of a valid driver’s license, and car information (make, model, color) and license plate to the Main Office.
3. Someone in the main office will help your student choose an available parking space.
4. The student will be issued a student parking sticker that should be placed above the registration sticker.
5. The student needs to park in the chosen parking space each day.

(For the safety of our students, we are limiting outside visitors. Therefore, the school will no longer allow outside delivery services. This would include services such as DoorDash, GrubHub, etc.)

Parents may deliver lunch

- Lunches need to be delivered to the vestibule by 10:30 am.
- Student's name and second period classroom number should be written on the bag.

An office aide will deliver the meal to the commons to be picked up with the meals ECI prepares. Students will not need to leave their classroom to pick up their lunch.
